History

The history of Massillon is an important point of pride for many residents. The following is a description of the city's origins, which can be found on the the City of Massillon's website.

“The Tuscarawas River served as a boundary line among the Indians as early as 1650. Later it was a boundary line between the French and the English, the English and the Indians, and finally, the states and the Indians. The Fort McIntosh Treaty of 1785 established the Tuscarawas River as the boundary between the Indians and the Territory of the United States. A boulder north of Massillon overlooking the river commemorates this

treaty. Ten years later, the Greenville Treaty reconfirmed this line. Massum Metcalf was the first white settler to come here in 1810, staying but a few years.”

“ The Ohio-Erie Canal opened in 1828, Massillon became known as the "Port of Massillon," with wheat being its principal export. Immense wagons of grain crowded the streets as farmers brought in their crops to be loaded on the canal barges or stored for later marketing.

The need for farm machinery brought forth a new industry—an industry destined to be the largest in the "Wheat City" for many years. In 1845, a thrashing machine built by Massillon's Russell brothers won first prize at the Ohio State Fair. By steadily improving "The Boss," as the machine was called, the three brothers were able to expand their factory until they were leading all competitors.

After the advent of the railroad in 1852, the future of Massillon was definitely insured. Industrial firms moved in, and the city maintained a steady, well-balanced growth. Pig-iron, glass, and coal mining industries cropped up. Another big industry was added when Joseph Davenport, the inventor, founded the Massillon Bridge Company. Davenport also invented and built the first locomotive "cowcatcher" and cab.

Massillon was incorporated as a village in 1853. The Board of Trade, organized in 1890, developed into the Chamber of Commerce in 1915.

Thus, year after year, thriving industrial activities have grown until Massillon became one of the foremost steel and metal working centers of the world. Massillon remains a vital center of steel making and fabricating. The city's industrial base continues to expand, with growing food processing, chemical processing and industrial machinery manufacturing becoming ever more important.”

Emotional tone

The city has a large focus on its pride and traditions. The emotional tone of the city appears to be quite positive regarding its football team and community pride, yet the tone takes a drastic turn regarding its current economy and economic growth future. Fear/Tension

The declining economy of Massillon acts and will continue to act as an additional stress for the residents. In addition to the weakening economy, Massillon also ranks slightly higher in crime rates compared to the rest of the US. Fear of becoming a crime victim also acts as an additional stress factor for residents of the community.

Positive outlook

Massillon is continually working towards city annexation, or city growth. Massillon has also been awarded a federal grant to undertake a comprehensive program of housing and community development activities, including housing assistance, infrastructure improvements, economic development, public services, fair housing, and planning activities. The city also boasts the Massillon Development Foundation, which is a non-profit development corporation responsible for recruiting new industry to Western Stark County and assisting local business to grow and succeed in the Massillon area. The primary goal of the organization is to help companies create and maintain jobs for the people of the community.

Community Pride

Massillon residents are incredibly proud of their city. The community is steeped in tradition and history, most notably in the area of high school football. According to ESPN, the Massillon tradition is so strong that every newborn baby boy is given a miniature football at birth. Massillon has had 23 players go on to play in the NFL such as Horace Gillom, Tommy James, Lin Houston, Jim Houston, Denny Franklin, Steve Luke and Chris Spielman. Not to mention the godfather of football, Paul Brown. In 2008 Massillon was amongst the final 4 candidates for ESPN's "Title town USA", which sought out to determine which US city had the strongest high school football pride.

Housing Conditions

City-Data.com lists the estimated median house or condo value in 2009 to be around \$98,732 (it was \$80,900 in 2000). This is significantly lower than the estimated median Ohio home value which is \$134,600. Homes in Massillon range in type including detached houses, townhouses, mobile homes and apartments. Most homes are considered middle class homes.

Building conditions

The older buildings have been somewhat kept up, yet some show signs of age such as deteriorating awnings. Newer buildings appear to be in good condition. (Windshield Survey)

Cleanliness

Similarly, the older down town areas of Massillon are not as well kept while the newer areas are very clean looking. The residential areas by and large appear clean and well kept. (Windshield Survey)

Fire Protection

Station # 1 – Headquarters 233 South Erie St. Massillon, OH. Central fire station was opened in 1970. It replaced the old central station that was constructed in 1895 and located on the site of the present administrative building of city hall. The administrative offices of the department are located here as well as the department maintenance shop. A quint engine, aerial tower and EMS unit respond from this station. The primary response district from this facility is the center of the city in addition to backing up the satellite stations.

Station # 2 - 17 17th St. N.W., Massillon, OH. Number two fire station was opened in 1980. It replaced the old number two station that was constructed in 1905 and located at Ninth and Tremont Avenue Southwest. An engine and EMS unit respond from this station. The primary response district from this facility is the Southwest and Northwest sections of the city.

Station # 3 - 955 Wales Rd. N.E., Massillon, OH. Number three fire station was opened in 1951. It replaced the old number three station that was constructed in 1906 and located at Eighth and State Avenue Northeast. An engine and EMS unit respond from this station. The primary response district from this facility is the Northeast and a portion of the Southeast areas of the city.

Station # 4 - 2720 Erie Street South, Massillon, OH. Number four fire station was opened in 1988. There had not been a fourth fire station in the city since 1906 when the city was still using volunteer firefighters to staff the satellite stations. An engine and EMS unit respond from this station. Primary response district from this facility is the Southeast areas of the city. It also backs up central station and responds to the center of the city

Police Protection

VI. COMMUNITY ELIMINATION/WASTE PATTERN

Describe:

Public sewage versus private septic

- Sewer and Waste Collections is the billing and accounting office for all sewer accounts within the City Limits of Massillon. Billing is done on a quarterly basis (every three (3) months) and is billed in arrears. All sewer billing is done on a flat rate basis, due to the fact that the City does not provide water service and therefore does not have access to the flow records. Water service is provided by Consumers Ohio Water Service, a privately owned company, (330) 833-4156. Approx 12,000 accounts are billed for sewer in Massillon.
- The EPA requires that any person whose property line is within 200 feet of a sanitary sewer system must hook up to the system, regardless of whether you live in a township or city. The City of Massillon is committed to eventually extending sanitary sewer to all city residents. However, some areas added to the City through annexation are still served by functioning septic systems. If your septic system fails, you will have to replace it at considerable cost (between \$8,000-\$12,000). Upon annexation, the City of Massillon can provide you with sanitary sewer hook-up to your property for \$50, compared to the County's fee of \$470-\$650. You then pay the annual fee outlined in question 5 in quarterly installments.
- Since the annexation to Massillon City, many residences of Jackson Township, Perry Township and Tuscarawas Township were offered the opportunity to hook-up to Massillon City Sewage System.

VIII. COMMUNITY SLEEP/REST PATTERN

Describe general atmosphere

During the day the local shops and businesses are open and people do at times walk around in the downtown area. During the day the traffic is heavy on Lincoln way one of the main roads in and out of downtown Massillon. During the lunch hours the local restaurant can get crowded for the lunch rush. During the evening hours the traffic can stay steady at times but slows down later at night. During the summer Lincoln way gets shut down for car shows and concerts where many people attend and can get really crowded all day long with people and traffic. During football games in the fall the traffic going around the stadium is backed up and sometimes at stand stills before and after the games. On the buildings in the downtown area there are murals painted on many of the buildings to brighten up the downtown area. Route 21 and Interstate 30 always have traffic through the entire day it can get crowded and heavy traffic around the marketplace plaza at peak hours of the day.

"Open All Night"

Many of the bars in and around town are open till around 2-3 am on weekends and different times during the week. There is a McDonald's in town that is open 24 hours a day and with a Taco Bell that is open to at least 3am, Wendy's till midnight. There is a speedway on Lincoln way that is open 24 hours that is right before the downtown area. At the Marketplace the Massilion Walmart is open 24 hours a day along with another Taco Bell town the street open till late.

Sex education in schools

Jackson High School:

1. Health class- one semester long; can be taken any year, though most take it freshman year
2. Sex education presentation- Stark County Health Department lead; one hour long and provided to freshman; there is an opt out clause
3. Relationship Matters Course- offered to juniors and seniors as an elective; if you need more information on this, I'd have to get you in contact with the teacher, Stephanie Anderson
4. Sold Out Abstinence Program- provided by the Pregnancy Support Center; three class days

As a Health teacher, we provide the students with approximately three weeks of sex education. The students learn what a healthy relationship is, dangers of unhealthy relationships, benefits of abstaining from sexual intercourse until marriage, problems they will avoid by abstaining, how to follow through on an abstinence plan, risks of teenage sexual activity, types of sexually transmitted diseases (bacterial, viral, parasitic), problems from STD's (treated or untreated), how to avoid risks, etc. As part of the Health class, the Sold Out program is presented to them. This builds on many of the same things I mentioned from the Health class itself but is more hands on and role play. The sex education program by the Health Department focuses a lot on statistics, specific STD's, and pictures (shock value stuff I suppose). Hope this helps.
